Beverly Hougland

Beverly Hougland is the Chief Executive Officer of the Osceola Council on Aging, where she has served for more than 28 years, beginning as a Program Director and subsequently appointed to Chief Executive Director in 1990. Beverly holds a Master of Arts Degree in Education from Eastern Kentucky University and has professional associations that include the Florida Council on Aging, the Local Board of Federal Emergency Management Agency, YMCA and the American Cancer Society.

The leadership that Beverly provides the Council's thirty multi-service programs is well known. She is instrumental in the agency's success, and the recipient of personal recognition and honors, including Who's Who in American Non-Profits in 1995; National Association for Community Leadership Distinguished Leadership Award 1999; Bank of America Local Hero Award 2005; St. Cloud/Greater Osceola County Chamber of Commerce Living Legend Award 2005; the prestigious 2006 Dr. Carter Osterbind Outstanding Florida Council on Aging Member; and the Osceola County Distinguished Leader Award 2008.

Beverly was recently appointed to the Governor's Commission on Volunteerism and Community Service, Disability Inclusion Committee in 2008; and the Board of Directors of the Florida Association of Service Providers, Legislative Committee Chair, also in 2008.

Bob Asztalos

Bob Asztalos has spent twenty-four years working in government affairs with various associations in Washington DC and Tallahassee. He has lobbied on health care issues at both the state and Federal levels since 1985. He has led several high profile campaigns conducted by Associations. From 2000 through 2001, he directed the nursing home tort reform campaign resulting in the passage of the Nursing Home Reform Act of 2001 and in 2003 he was the Director of the HEAL Coalition which was a Coalition of health care associations and groups created by the Florida Hospital Association and the Florida Medical Association. Its work led to the passage of the Medical Malpractice Reform Act that year in a special session of the Legislature. Bob has been conducting grassroots and legislative education programs for over 16 years to non-profit organizations. He has developed grassroots education programs and coordinated activities for the American Physical Therapy Association and the American Health Care Association in Washington DC. Other activities included creating "how to" videos, booklets, flyers as well as coordinating their legislative meetings. Since 1999, he has continued these activities in Florida for the Florida Health Care Association, Florida Adult Day Care Association, Florida Hospital Association, Easter Seals Florida and the Florida Association of Senior Centers. Bob graduated from George Washington University with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. He also attended G.W.U. for graduate school and received a Masters degree specializing in Legislative Affairs.

Charles T. Corley

Charles T. Corley serves as the Deputy Secretary of the Florida Department of Elder Affairs. Prior to this position he briefly served as the department's interim secretary in early 2007 and also as the department's director of statewide community-based services from 2000-2006.

Deputy Secretary Corley has worked in the health and human services field for more than 27 years as a direct service provider and administrator. He has served as a hospital administrator and a consultant in the area of hospital and nursing home certificates of need and has been extensively involved in the expansion of home- and community-based programs as an alternative to nursing home placement since coming to work for the department.

Deputy Secretary Corley received his Bachelor of Science degree from Florida State University and attended the graduate health care management program at the University of South Florida.
